

Singles in Bob Doubles

If you are about to make seconds you are unaffected (That's the best place to call it from)

If you are about to do a 3/4 down dodge you make the single by doing 2 blows in 3rds and then returning to the back for 2 blows in 5ths and then run in.

If you were about to do 4 blows behind you do 2 in 5ths and then run in

If you were about to dodge 3/4 up you plain hunt out to 5ths and do 2 blows in 5ths and return to lead.

Then carry on as normal according to where you pass the treble (Colour pencils and paper are the order of the day)

<u>So - for example</u> At the First Lead end in a plain course you would have.		If a Single is called You would get

In the above the highlighted bell (2) is making the single.

The 3 is the unaffected bell.
